As supper was ending, Jesus took the cup of wine, and when he had given thanks, he gave it to them, and said: "Drink this, all of you: This is my Blood of the new Covenant, which is poured out for you and for all for the forgiveness of sins. Whenever you drink it, do this for the remembrance of me."

Therefore we proclaim the mystery of faith:





St. Michael's Learn & Connect

Education for Ministry has added a new program Education for Ministry (EfM) is a program of theological study provided by the School of Theology of the University of the South in Sewanee, Tennessee.

The study is done in a seminar class which meets once a week throughout the academic year, about 36 weeks, under the guidance of trained mentors. This is a small "community" of learners studying together.

Beginning this year there are two options for study:

EfM Classic

The 50-year-old program of four years, one year at a time, is rebranded as "EfM: Classic." It is only offered, as it has always been, by accredited mentors. The four years are:

- Year 1: Hebrew Scriptures (Old Testament)
- Year 2: Christian Scriptures (New Testament)
- Year 3: Church History
- Year 4: Christian Ethics and Spirituality

EfM: Wide Angle

This new class is a 1 year offering for those who wish to have a "taste of all four years in one year." Wide Angle can be offered as a stand-alone group or participants in Wide Angle can join a group of EfM: Classic. EfM Wide Angle can only be offered by accredited mentors. Depending on numbers, we anticipate this will be offered at St. Michael's in coordination with the EfM Classic seminar. We are now recruiting for the 2025-2026 academic year.
